MISSION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Maui High School Foundation promotes the pursuit of higher education by awarding scholarship grants to deserving seniors of Maui High School.

Don, Alice, Carl Yamaoka Memorial Scholarship Mission - Two of the scholarships are being offered in memory of Don and Alice (parents), and Carl (son) Yamaoka. Don Haruo was a graduate of Maui High School in 1943, and the son of Sataro and Kuma Yamaoka of Olinda. Alice and Carl were graduates of Baldwin High School. Don, Alice and Carl's lives were cut short of terminal illnesses. The purpose of these scholarships are to support recipients in the healthcare field. In the recent Maui News, Maui has been reported as being short on medical doctors and specialized physicians. These scholarships are to recipients who intend to make a health career on Maui and serving the communities on this island.

AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

The Maui High School Foundation's Scholarship Program is funded from various donations and/or activities held throughout the year. For 2020, the following are expected to be awarded: ONE \$1000 sponsored by the Maui High School Foundation & TWO \$500 HEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS sponsored by Don, Alice, Carl Yamaoka Memorial Scholarship is funded by, daughter, Joy Yamaoka.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be a 2020 graduate of Maui High School with a weighted cumulative high school grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicant must complete the application and provide all required documents by the stated deadline. The Scholarship Judges reserve the right to request supplemental materials from any Applicant.
- You must be a State of Hawaii program completer in the Health Services pathway. A Program of Study includes at least two credits in the sequence of a single career pathway program area plus one required academic course.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The Scholarship Judges’ decision will be based on

- The Applicant’s weighted cumulative grade point average (20%);
- The Applicant’s high school activities, awards, honors, employment, and community service activities (20%);
- A Presentation including a Question and Answer portion (50%); and
- One letter of recommendation (10%).

All decisions by the Scholarship Judges are final.

The completed application packet which includes application, resume and letter of recommendation must be emailed to the Maui High School Foundation at foundation@mauihigh.org by 4:00 pm on February 14th, 2020 Application documents must be submitted in one PDF document. Please do not submit separate files.

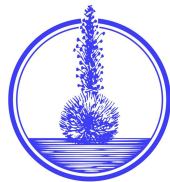
