### ASVAB AT MHS

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test will be offered at Maui High School on Thursday, September 22nd. The primary purpose of the ASVAB test is to help students and school counselors discover where a student's basic aptitude lies. The primary purpose is not for enlistment in the military (although the test scores can be used for military enlistment). Test results will only be released to the student and the school. No student information will be released to the military services through the ASVAB test. Students interested in taking the ASVAB test must sign up in B100.

### PRELIMINARY SAT

The Preliminary SAT (PSAT) test will be offered at Maui High School on **Wednesday**, **October 14th** from 8:00 am - 12:15 pm in the library. The PSAT test prepares students for the SAT test by exposing students to similar test questions; assessing each students reading, math, and writing skills; and providing specific suggestions on how each student can improve his/her individual academic skills for the new SAT test. The PSAT also qualifies 11th grade students for the National Merit Scholarship competition.

This past summer, 17 Maui High students experienced HOSA's first ever International Leadership Conference held at Tennessee's Music City, Nashville. The event had over 9,000 delegates in attendance. Maui High freshmen Blessiemae Paguirigan, Taysia Aspili, Shmily Versola, and Cheyenne Kamea Magno captured a first place medal in Health Education!

Health Occupations Students of America is a national student-led organization that helps secondary and postsecondary students pursue their dreams of being in the health field by providing different events and topics relevant to their desired careers. These events include Medical Terminology, Dental Terminology, Nursing Assisting, Health Career Display board, and Medical Math.

The 17 MHS participants worked their way up to national competition by placing at the district level in January followed by state level in February. The group then worked extremely hard to fundraise for their trip to Tennessee. Juniors, Sheena Marie Garo and Jamaica Aquino also placed 5th for their event Health Career Display Board. With the guidance of their advisors, Mr. Aaron Joyo, Mrs. Grace Akaou, Mrs. Lupe Anitema, Mr. Bob Steele, and the support of their school and family, Maui High HOSA did a dynamite job representing Hawaii at Tennessee.

Maui students Joanna Aceret and Mike Nguyen also placed 10th for their event CPR and First-Aid, proudly representing Lahainaluna High School.

### NATIONAL ACADEMY SCHOLAR

Congratulations to Class of 2016's Jellyfer Tamayo for being 1 of 14 students nationwide to receive a National Academy Foundation (NAF)Scholarship. Jellyfer received a Hospitality and Tourism Scholarship sponsored by Marriott International Inc.

NAF is a national network of education, business, and community leaders who work together to ensure high school students are college, career, and future ready. Since 1982, NAF has been partnering with existing high schools in high-need communities to enhance school systems at a low cost by implementing NAF academies – small learning communities within traditional high schools. NAF has grown from one NAF Academy of Finance in New York City to hundreds of academies across the country focusing on growing industries including: finance, hospitality & tourism, information technology, engineering, and health sciences.

At Maui High two academies are available to students, the Academy of Hospitality & Tourism and the Academy of Finacnce. Maui High is 1 of only 6 high schools in the state to integrate NAF Academies into course offerings.

### POSITIVE IMPACT AWARDS



Congratulations to senior Briana Yamamoto for being 1 of 8 *Triple-Impact Competitor* scholarship winners in the state. The scholarship was presented at Hawaii's Positive Impact Awards held in August on Oahu by Positive Coaching Alliance in conjunction with Hawaii State Federal Credit Union and JACO Physical Therapy.

The Triple-Impact Competitor award looks for three elements in a student-athlete. They are:

- Personal Mastery: Making oneself better
- Leadership: Making one's teammates better
- Honoring the Game: Making the game better.

### BUILINING NEW FRIENDSHIPS THROUGH SPORTS

Last school year, under the leadership of team coaches Jessica Adkins and Barbara Sowers, Maui High students proudly participated in Area (regional) and State level Special Olympics Games and in the HHSAA State Track and Field Meet for Unified Team Relay events. This was the first year Maui High has participated in the Unified Sports program. In fact, Maui High is the only school in the County currently fielding teams to train and compete under the Unified Sports platform.

Just what is Unified Sports exactly?

"Dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition experiences, Unified Sports joins people with and without intellectual disabilities on the same team. It was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to friendship and understanding. Unified Sports is also an integral part of the Special Olympics Unified Strategy for Schools, which was founded in 2008 and funded through the U.S. Department of Education to use Special Olympics as a way to build inclusion and tolerance in schools." -(http://www.specialolympics.org)

Sophomore Robert Russell, a member of Saber Football and Wrestling, joined Maui High's "Unified" delegation in February. "I was approached by my PE teacher and I said yes because I wanted to help. I know that special needs kids have a harder time making new friends. I wanted to be one of those people who would be there for them."

Coach Adkins tells us the teammates spent two days per week training together for 3 months. General education students like Robert volunteered their time to work with intellectually disabled athletes on event technique. They also took them under their care on trips and competed with them in team relays. "I loved it. It was a great experience," Robert shares. "It taught me how to communicate better and exercised my patience, and we had a lot of fun meeting kids from the other islands."

Maui High's Unified Athletes had 8 first place finishes and 11 second place finishes in the Special Olympic Summer Games. For the State Track and Field Meet Maui High teams placed 3rd and 7th in the Mixed 4x100 Meter Unified Team Relay Finals and 5th and 7th in the Mixed 4x400 Meter Unified Team Relay Finals.
