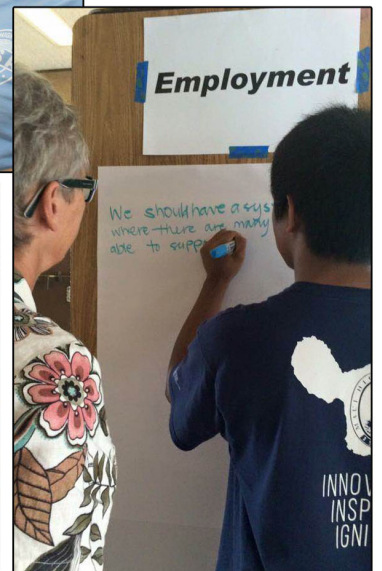

## 808 DIGITAL STORYTELLING

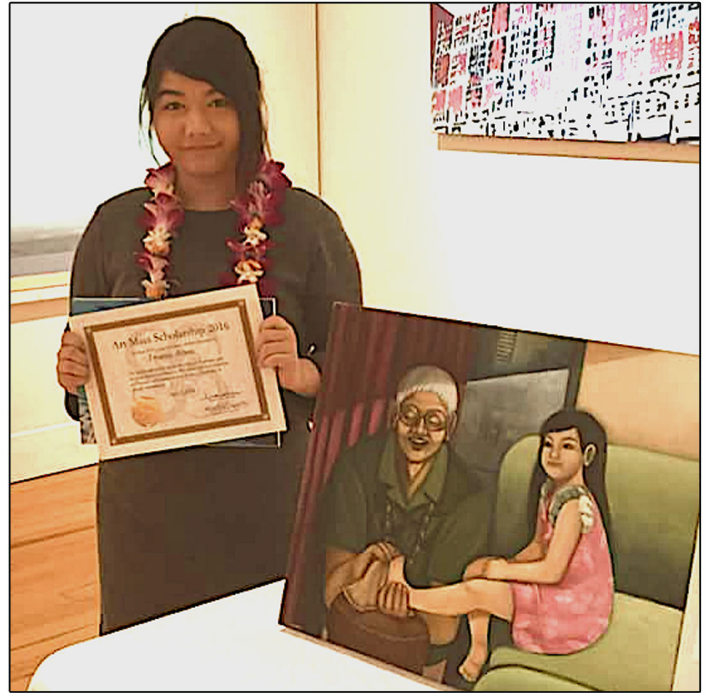
MHS ACOM has won up to \$1,000 for the purchase of equipment in the Digital 808 Storytellers contest. The winning films were:

## CHEMISTRY OLYMPIAD

On March 7-9, 2016 students throughout the state (Public & Private) had an opportunity to take the Chemistry Olympiad Exam. The top 10 scorers receive an opportunity to take the National Exam on April 22, 2016 at Leeward Community College on Oahu.

Two Maui High Students, Laney Flanagan (gr. 10) and Damien Dumayas (gr. 12), qualified to take the National Exam by scoring in the top 10 in the state. They are a part of an elite group of approximately 1000 students nationwide who have the honor to participate in the National Level Chemistry Olympiad Exam this year. Past Maui High students who have scored in the top 10 have gone on to top universities such as MIT, Stanford, Harvard, and Yale.



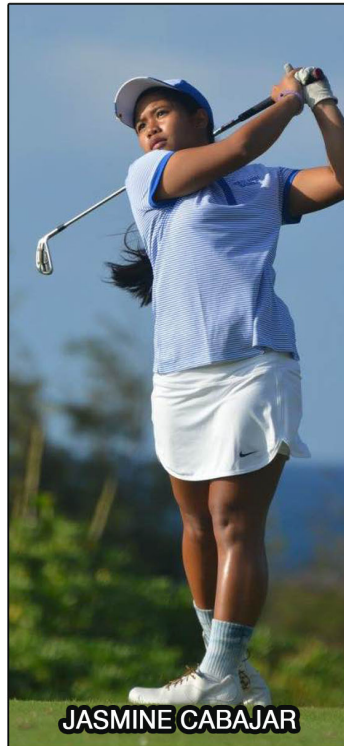
# SABER ATHLETICS

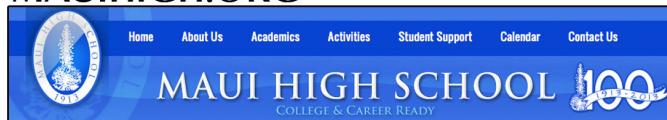

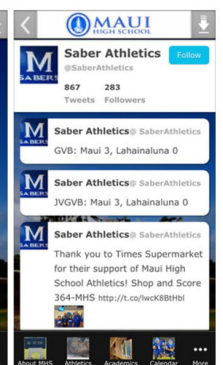
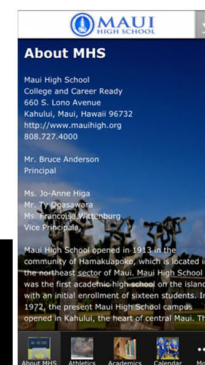
