Congratulations to all 148 members of our Saber Marching Band for placing 3rd in their division in Kamehameha's 40th Annual Tournament of Bands competition. According to band members their show 'Beyond the Light' was filled with variation. "There was a lot going on," says senior Jolene Pascua. "We had a lot of choreo, props, effects, drills. We're definitely proud of our show." Fellow bandmate Camryn Enriques shares, "It's always rewarding to look back and see how far you've come through the season. And in competition, we weren't too far off. The scores were close. We know it was a tight one."

Congratulations to Maui High Varsity and JV Cheer teams for placing end in their divisions at the MIL Cheerleading Competition held on Octobet 30th at Maui High gym. The second place finish gives Head Coach Shelby Ah Wan's Varsity squad a bid to states for the 2nd year in a row. Prior to these recent 2 years, Maui High had a long absence from state competition.
According to team co-captain and Ord year cheerleader Lindzi Iakasaki the Sabers' two and a half minute routine came amped with a higher level of difficulty than in past years. "Each routine has a scoring range based on its level of difficulty for things like jumps, stunts, tumbling, etc. Our coach really gave us our best chance by helping us piece together a routine that made the max amount of points possible to us. It's been a season of trying new things, and there were a lot of changes right up to the end."
State competition on Oahu will be held Saturday, November 19th and will air live on OC16. "We're looking forward to it. Having been there last year, now we know what to expect. We are going into states looking for a stronger overall finish," concludes Lindzi.




## SENIOR PROJECT KOKUA DRIVE

"What you can spare, they can wear!" This was the catch phrase that motivated many to support the cause of yet another commendable Maui High Senior project.
Seniors Chattel Martin and Kyra Duldulao chose to do a project that would help our homeless community. With the support of their parents the girls organized a two-step project that first entailed a Donation Day, and then a week later, a Distribution Day.
Chattel and Kyra created posters and banners to advertise their call for donations of items that might be useful to others less fortunate. According to Chantel, the most effective advertising of their efforts came by way of social media. "Facebook and Instagram. That helped spread the word a lot. A lot of family, friends, and also strangers came by to donate things."
Donation Day was a success. The girls collected a lot of items that they could then offer to others in need. "Shoes were probably the best donation," they tell us. "We received a lot of shoes, and all kinds of sizes. With winter coming, having shoes will definitely make a difference for someone."
To get the word out to those in need about the distribution day, Chantel and Kyra, along with family members, spent 2 days handing out flyers to the

homeless community in the area. Their outreach ifforts paid off. "We had a good turn out," Chanted says. "Many people came by to see if there was something they needed or could use, and they shared their stories. We gave out Blessing Bags and water to everyone."
The blessing bags contained snacks and toiletries. The two seniors funded the blessing bags partially through donations and covered the rest with their own donation to the Kokua Drive. Overall the project took 3 months to plan and execute, it enlisted approximately 10 volunteers, touched dozens of lives, and has inspired countless more.

Successful completion of a Senior Project is a graduation requirement at Maui High School. All year long MHS Seniors are creating and experiencing their own amazing senior project stories.
