All juniors at Maui High will be given an ACT exam free of charge on Feb. 28, 2017.
Free SAT and ACT practice tests and preparation booklets are available in B100. Students are encouraged to also utilize Khan Academy for SAT prep lessons.
Students on free or reduced lunch status qualify for free SAT, ACT, and PSAT tests, free college applications, free Running Start Courses at UH Maui College, and a big discount for each AP test. Juniors and seniors on free or reduced lunch status may see Mr. Iwata in B100 to receive fee waivers for the SAT and ACT tests. Test fee waivers are also available in B100 through the federally funded TRIO programs.

## ACT STUDENT READINESS EXEMPLAR



Maui High senior Son Phon has been named as the 2017 state exemplar for Hawaii in the Student Readiness category of the 2016-17 ACT College and Career Readiness Campaign!
This award is quite a selevctive one. First, only students that have been identified by ACT based on data students provide to ACT when they take the test may submit an applycation to be considered for the honor. Then, ACT State Councils made up of education and workforce professionals determine just one exemplar for thier state. That's right, just one for each state! Student state exemplar's each receive a $\$ 500$ scholarship and are then considered to be a semifinalist for the National Exemplar announced in October later this year. When asked how he feels about the award Phat replied, "lt's a really great honor but mostly I'm appreciative to my
mentors, like Mr. Ginoza and all my teachers at Maui High. I'm grateful to them for building me up to this point."
Currently Phat holds a 4.0 GPA , is enrolled in three AP courses, and serves as president of Maui High's Math League, president of MHS PAAC, member of Maui High's Science Bowl team, HOSA, Key Club, and National Honor Society. He also volunteers at the MACC and assists students on campus who speak Vietnamese as thier first language with their studies.
Phan has his eyes set on 2 colleges in particular, Hearvard University and University of Pennsylvania. He says both offer an all around good program as he is yet weighing which program of study he'd like to pursue.
According to ACT "the campaign was developed to help states shine a light on indviduals and institutions that are doing more with less, overcoming obstacles, and serving as examples to others to improve the condition of college and career readiness for all." Phon is definitely a stand out example for us all!

## SCIENCE BOWL TEAM LANDS IN TOP FOUR IN STATE

The Maui High Science Bowl and Ocean Sciences Bowl teams competed in state competitions on Jan 28 and Feb 4, 2017 on Oahu.
On January 28th at the State Regional Science Bowl completion, Maui High Team A swept through the morning preliminary round without a lost. In the afternoon semifinal round, Maui High faced McKinley I and lost by 2 points after defeating them in morning round. In the third place round, Punahou 2 defeated Maui High, placing Maui High in fourth. Maui High's team consisted of seniors, Joseph Kim, and Son Shan, juniors, Laney Flanagan and Kain Jabber and sophomore, Kaitlyn Takeno. Punahou 1 defeated McKinley 1 in the finals. Punahou 1 will compete in the NSB finals in Washington, D.C.

With only a week to prepare, Maui High Ocean Sciences Bowl team entered the Aloha Bowl competition with 2 teams, team A and B. Maui High's team A would again complete the preliminary rounds without a defeat, winning all of it's 6 matches and entering the championship round as the no. 1 seed. However, team A could not answer the last bonus question. Kalani B would go on to the final and defeat NESCi, a home school team. As a result of it's record in the elimination round, Maui High was awarded third place. Each member of the team received a \$50 Apple gift card. Team A members were Joseph Kim, Son Shan, Laney Flanagan, One Jae Lee, and Kain Jabbar.
As a result of their win Kalani B will go to the Natonal Ocean Science Bowl on April 27-30 in Portland, Oregon. Each of the winning team received a \$250 Apple cash card.
Maui High's Team B won the Spirit Award. Each member of team $B$ received \$25 Apple gift card. Team B members were Jason Gumboc, Kaitlyn Takeno, Marielle Cedano, Josh Lee, and Briana Lazo-Corado.
Maui High's teams were coached by Ed Ginoza and Greg Jones. CONGRATULATIONS to all team members and coaches and mahalo for representing our school so well.

February 1st was National Signing Day, the first day that a high school senior can sign a binding National Letter of Intent to play college football for an NCAA school. On that day, Maui High's Feleti Afemui, who has been on college football scouting radars for the past year, signed with Vanderbilt University - his parents, coaches, faculty, family, and friends proudly bearing witness.
The 6'3", 222lb. senior linebacker and 2017 MIL Defensive Player of the Year led the Saber defense with an MVP peformance consisting of 61 solo tackles ( 16 of which were tackles for loss), 3.5 sacks, 8 QB hurries, 3 pass breakups, 3 forced fumbles, and 1 fumble return for a touchdown.
