Congratulations to Camryn Ban for being 1 of 28 juniors in our state selected as a 2017 Islander Scholar, a program presented by Malama Learning Center and Islander Institute.

Islander Scholars are selected for their character, compassion, resilience, wellbeing, aloha, and actions that demonstrate six comprehensive learning outcomes rooted in Hawai'i's culture and environment. These outcomes, called Nā Hopena A'o or HĀ, include a strengthened sense of Belonging; Responsibility; Excellence; Aloha; Total Well-Being; and Hawai'i, spelling out BREATH, which we know as HĀ. Hawaii high school principals selected 1 junior in their school who exemplifies these characteristics through their actions in school, community, and families to be their school's Islander Scholar.

In June 2017, Islander Scholars will convene in a unique three-day experience to connect them with one another, explore their kuleana, learn from distinguished community mentors, and meet last year's Islander Scholars.

ALOHA BACKPACK BUDDIES SIGN UP TODAY

The ALOHA BACK PACK BUDDIES program is available now to qualifying students in need. Forms to sign-up is available from your grade level counselor in B-100.

This program, which is provided by the Maui Food Bank, provides a supplemental supply of easy-to-prepare food to students for the weekend. Students on free/reduced lunch automatically qualify for the program. For further inquiry contact Mrs. Woodson at 727-4051. First-come, first-served enrollment for qualifying students.

SUMMER E-SCHOOL

E-School's Summer online program offers a variety of rigorous courses in Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, Health, and Fine Arts. Classes are open to Hawai'i resident high school students (including incoming 9th graders for the 2017-2018 school year). E-School Courses are not recommended as a credit recovery option.

Online Registration Runs from Monday, May 8 at 8:00 am through Friday, May 19 at 2:30 pm.

Parents must register their child online for summer school courses. Due to the accelerated nature of E-School courses, students can only sign up for a maximum of two classes.

COST: \$95.00 per .5 credit (1 semester course)
