Registration Requirements for Summer Session

- Student must be 15 1/2–19 years of age and must have their current Hawaii State Learners Permit on the application date.

- Student must attend all 23 classroom sessions plus MANDATORY parent night. Students will not be excused for any tardies, absences, vacations, or early releases.
- Students must be able to complete 40 hours of daylight practice driving and 10 hours of night practice driving with a licensed adult (over age 21)
