MHS GYM NAMED IN HONOR OF SHINE MATSUI

It was a chilly and overcast Thursday afternoon, but that didn't stop a healthy crowd of students, alumni, faculty, family, and friends from gathering in front of the Izumi Shine Matsui Athletic Center on December 14th to witness its dedication.

Shine Matsui served Maui High as a teacher, coach and then Athletic Director for nearly 30 years, from 1959 to 1988. He was honored for his contributions in the development of Maui High's Athletic Department and for creating athletic opportunities for students. Curtis Lee, a recipient of Shine's mentorship, says "Shine helped to implement women's sports even before

title IX.... He also helped his athletes get scholarships to colleges." Shine oversaw the construction of the gym in 1979. In a 2014 interview, wife Masayo Matsui joked, "he was so dedicated, we used to tease him that the Maui High gym was his first home."

Principal Jamie Yap states "this is one of many steps we as a school hope to take in creating an atmosphere that celebrates our Saber legacy."

SENIOR SECURES FULL RIDE TO MIT

Senior, Laney Flanagan, has been awarded a full fouryear scholarship and admission to Massachusetts Institute of Technology through Questbridge's 2017 National College Match program. College Match is a national program that pairs high-achieving, low- income high school seniors with full scholarships to the nation's top colleges. Starting with a pool of 15,606 applicants, QuestBridge chose 5,759 Finalists, of which 918 outstanding students have been selected as this year's College Match Scholarship Recipients. Laney was 1 of 7 to be selected by MIT.

Laney is also a National Merit Semifinalist, a member of Maui High Math League and a captain of our Science Bowl and Ocean Sciences Bowls teams. She was also on the team to compete in Academic Hawaii earlier this year which placed 3rd in the state among public and private high schoools. In addition to being academically exceptional, she has also been apart of Maui High soccer and judo teams. She is also a volunteer at the Maui Humane Society and tutors at a neighboring elementary school. Laney is the daughter of Holly Henson of Kihei.

WORLD QUEST SUCCESS

Maui High PAAC members competed in a statewide World Quest competition on December 2nd and achieved the highest score among Maui County schools. The Academic WorldQuest Competition is an exciting global trivia competition for high school students. Competition was held at different sites across the state and streamed live. Top performing teams in each county received Amazon gift cards.

NA MELE ART CONTEST WINNER





He looks forward to further developing his craft and definitely considers it a future career possibility.
